From The Rectory

October 31st 2017 marks both a beginning and an ending.

Firstly, a beginning. On that day the world will commemorating the 500th anniversary of Martin Luther's posting his *Ninety-Five Theses* on the door of the *Schloss Kirche* in Wittenberg, Eastern Germany.

Although John Wycliffe had been advocating the reformation of the Church in England 150 years earlier and Jan Hus had been burnt at the stake in Prague for having similar thoughts in 1415, 31st October 1517 is a date now considered to be the start of the Reformation and is commemorated annually as Reformation Day.

Martin Luther was born at Eisleben in Saxony in 1483; he was the son of a copper miner. After attending Erfurt University, and fearful of death and judgment, he entered the Augustinian monastery in Erfurt but did not find there the peace with God he anticipated.

Taking his vows as a monk in 1506, he was ordained priest in 1507. He turned to the study of theology at which he excelled and by 1512 he had received both his doctorate and the chair of theology at Wittenberg University.

At some point between 1512 and 1515 Luther had his so-called 'Tower experience' which marked a fundamental shift in his theology and faith.

Through studying the Scriptures – notably Romans 1.17, 'the righteous shall live by faith' – he came to believe that Christians are saved not through their own efforts but by the gift of God's grace, which they accept by faith. Once he had grasped this truth he was transformed from someone fearful of God's wrath into a


fearless critic of a Church that was failing to teach this fundamental truth.

Luther's increasing disillusion with the Roman Catholic Church was brought to a head by the indulgence controversy which resulted in those *Ninety-Five Theses*, being published.

What was intended to initiate an academic debate quickly got out of hand and Luther was excommunicated in 1521. Anti-catholic States began to emerge in Germany. By 1529 the word 'Protestant' had been coined to describe their beliefs.

Though reform not schism was his aim, Luther stuck to his beliefs when Rome declined to reform itself, even along the conservative lines favoured by Luther.

In addition to the doctrine of justification by faith he asserted much of which is accepted as the norm in the Church of England today - the priesthood of all believers, the concept of national Churches, vernacular Scripture and liturgy, the use of hymns in worship and the freedom for clergy to marry.

Luther was successful in challenging the might of the Catholic Church partly because the intellectual changes of the Renaissance made such challenges acceptable, partly because the political situation in Germany was favourable to a new religious dimension, and partly because the technology to disseminate his ideas (the printing press was the 16th Century equivalent of the internet) had recently been invented. But, most importantly, it was his personal courage and willingness to risk his life for the truth that allowed the Reformation to be born and to develop. He died, just a few metres from where he was born, at Eisleben in1546.

Luther was a very human being who spoke from the heart – often in violent and earthy imagery – Luther saw life as a constant spiritual struggle in which he was only able be victorious through Christ's grace freely bestowed on him.

So, as we commemorate a beginning and we shall also note the ending of my ministry here in Camerton and Dunkerton because on that day as Sylvia and I will retire. So, I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your love and support in all the joys and challenges of the last seven years. It has been a real privilege to serve both you and God in such a lovely place. Please come and join us for our last service – a Benefice Communion – at Camerton on 29th October at 9.30am. God bless you all!

Your rubbish collection is changing from 6 November

Look out for your new wheeled bin or re-usable rubbish bag delivered to your home between 25 September and early November.

Preparations are moving forward for the new service.

What is changing and why?

From 6 November we will be collecting rubbish every other week in wheeled bins or re-usable bags for the majority of residents. Recycling, including food waste will continue to be collected weekly. The chargeable garden waste collections will remain every other week. The changes will help to keep the streets cleaner, increase recycling and make the services more affordable.

Find out your container allocation

In March we sent a letter out with the Council Tax bill to let you know what container you had been allocated. To check your allocation, enter your address at www.bathnes.gov.uk/recycle or contact Council Connect.

If you have a query with your allocation please contact Council Connect. Where households have 2 or more children in nappies, 6 or more people in their household or a clear medical need they may be able to apply for a larger bin.

If you need to change your allocation, please contact Council Connect on 01225 394000. They will talk through your needs, and then if appropriate pass on your request for change of container. We will contact you to let you know the outcome of your request. In the meantime, your original allocated container will be delivered to you before the start of the new collection as it will be too late to prevent this happening. If we have agreed to issue an alternative container, we will arrange to replace your original with your changed container.

What happens next?

- Week beginning 28 August Royal Mail will deliver a leaflet to you giving you more information about the new service
- From 25 September to early November— we will deliver the wheeled bins/re-usable rubbish bags to 78,000 households. The bins will be delivered to the front edge of your property or your re-usable rubbish bag will be delivered to your door.

Please

- do not put out your new bin/bag for collection until 6 November
- continue to put out your rubbish as you normally do until the new collection starts
- put out your rubbish for collection in your new bin/bag on your correct collection day from 6 November

Your bin/bag will be delivered with a **welcome pack** which will include further information about the new collection service including:

- How to use your new bin/bag collection
- Right day, right week collection calendar for 2017-18 – please check carefully as your collection day may have changed, so it's even more important to make sure your recycling and rubbish is out by 7am. You can sign up now for text message reminders of when your new collection is due. Text your postcode to 07520 631700
- Details of Christmas and New Year changes
- How to make the most of your recycling collections
- 2 stickers to put on your recycling boxes to help you separate your recycling

Getting ready for the new service

• Please make sure you recycle all you can, including your food waste. You can order extra free recycling containers at www.bathnes.gov.uk/orderacontainer

If you prefer, **from 7 August** you can collect recycling containers at one of the three Recycling Centres, rather than wait for one to be delivered.

- Check our website for the latest updates. Check to see if your query is answered in over 30 FAQs we have on our website www.bathnes.gov.uk/recycle
- Visit one of our roadshows to see the new containers and find out more. Go to www.bathnes.gov.uk/roadshows for details and check on our website to find out where our display wheeled bins are.

- We are promoting re-usable nappies to help reduce waste. We are selling packs of Bambino Mio re-usable nappies for £150 (£100 less than the retail price).
- Resident's packs we are developing website materials you can download for free to help share messages with neighbours to advise them how to set out their waste etc. The website will explain this further and include a leaflet and tick-card to post to neighbours explaining how to use the service properly.

Report on the Dunkerton & Tunley Parish Council Parish Council Meeting 31 August & 14 Sept 2017

A summary of issues discussed and decisions made is as follows:

Tunley-Overdale Footpath.

The priority is to concentrate on having the signage omissions and mistakes corrected so Cllr Robinson to write to Steve Froggatt accordingly. Once this work has been completed the Parish Council will open discussions with B&NES Highways regarding the Road Safety Audit.

Defibrillators.

Following the results of the consultation at the next scheduled parish council meeting the Parish Council will vote on a fully costed proposal to install 2 defibrillators – one in Tunley and one in Dunkerton.

Finger Post Restoration Project. Once the WCI Grant and Community Empowerment Funds are received the Parish Council will initiate the work with Kelston Forge.

CIL Funding of New Footpath by AVS Site.

Following a site meeting BANES highways has agreed to take this proposal forward for funding, which will either be provided through the normal projects funding route or through the newly emerging CIL process. Either way, the proposal will still need to be cost/benefit scored. It was very clear from the discussion with BANES Highways that if this is funded by B&NES from monies received via the CIL, then B&NES will be looking for DTPC to contribute the full amount it received from the CIL.

Consultation on Other Candidates for CIL Funding. One further idea had been received –

landscaping of Dunkerton Green - since the last meeting. Before any decision is made the Parish Council is awaiting the outcome of the discussions with BANES re the new footpath by the AVS site. The clerk explained that we have five years from receipt to spend this money.

Public Rights of Way (PROW).

Remedial Work and Obstruction of PROW at the Equestrian Centre. It was reported that remedial work at Tunley Equestrian Centre would be commenced in September. The plan is to form a catch pit to collect water running from the stables then install a pipe with clean stone round the pipe to form a soak away. Hardcore will be laid to leave a clean surface to walk on and 2 metal kissing gates will be installed at the top and bottom of the field. If the horse box and the tree leaning on it have not been removed by the end of this week a contractor will move both away from the footpath. It will be up to the centre to keep the catch pit free from clogging up with straw.

Clearance Including Approval of a Tender for PROW Clearance. Most of the PROW clearance that Councillors said they would do voluntarily as a stopgap measure had been completed. The rest is in hand and there has been no further complaints. Going forward, to ensure a long-term solution a tender for PROW clearance has been drawn up.

Dunkerton Cricket Ground

Approval of agreement with Bristol Lions Cricket Club for Use of the Cricket Ground from 2018

The Parish Council has received a welcome and unexpected interest in the use of the cricket ground by Bristol Lions Cricket Club. In order for them to be able to use the cricket ground from the start of the 2018 season the club required access from 1 September 2017. Therefore an agreement allowing them use of the ground until 2025 has been drafted, agreed and signed with them during August. Part of this agreement involves them undertaking improvement work to the ground and pavilion. The agreement needs ratification by the Parish Council at this meeting. It was proposed Cllr Robinson, seconded Cllr Gardiner to ratify the agreement made with Bristol Lions for use of the cricket ground and pavilion for the cricket seasons 2018 to 2025. Approved. (Post meeting note: a copy of the agreement will be posted for information on the Parish Website).

New Community Café/Shop/Sports Facility to be located in a new build

The Parish Council has been in discussion about a new building being erected to replace the pavilion. The parish council is not in a position take on the large package of work this would involve and therefor needs to be run as a standalone project. Any resulting building could, as has been proposed by Emma Mannings, serve as a community centre, café, shop and involve other sports. Replacing the pavilion could involve EU funding from the "Leader Programme" administered locally by the West of England Rural

Network. At the meeting on the 14 September it was agreed that Emma Mannings would form a working group and draw up a project plan to be submitted to the parish council. This plan would be with the intention of applying for the EU funding for a community run facility with a management committee formed from parishioners incorporating a privately run café leased from the parish council. The working group will at an early stage discuss with the cricket club the relationship with the club and how it ties in with their plans for the existing pavilion. Application for a COPSE pack of 10 of each species - silver birch, rowan, wild cherry – has been successful.

Temporary Event on the Batch

Issues reported to BANES range from noise nuisance to unauthorised licensable activity beyond midnight. These issues will be discussed at the Licensing Enforcement Group within BANES Council. Ahead of this the Parish Council has submitted its views. (Post meeting note: Following the Enforcement Group meeting, BANES have asked that the Parish Council and local representatives meet with them and the Police to discuss how this event and others like it could be managed better in future).

Finance

The balance of funds as at 31 August is £15,915.63.

Planning

Planning Application REF 16/06226/LBA Crossways House Crossways Lane Dunkerton:

Internal and external alterations for the erection of front boundary wall, gates and railings; internal washroom alterations, removal of former car parking at front and rear and to return garden. Erection of new skittles building following demolition of existing. PENDING DECISION.

Planning Application REF 17/00163/FUL Stonedge Cottage Stoneage Lane Tunley Bath: Alterations to raise the wall to the same level as the neighbour's wall, including the existing panel fence. (Resubmission) APPROVED.

Avalon House (Fence) – APPEAL DISMISSED.

Highways and Related Topics

Swan Bus Shelter Land - Damage caused It was reported that during recent works by Western Power on overhead power lines in the parish, the contractors had (without permission) driven heavy machinery across the Council's land by the bus shelter and in doing so had, it seemed, damaged the boundary fence. No repairs seemed to have been carried out. It was agreed that the Clerk was to write to Western Power Distribution about the damage.

Damage to Engine Bridge - Progress Report from Department of Transport (Historic Railways Estate)

A reply had been received. It was reported that the damage is not considered serious enough to endanger safety, so the Department of Transport will not be repairing the bridge. It was agreed that the Clerk was to contact the Somerset Canal Society to see if they are interested in undertaking a repair.

Report from the Manders Orchard Group

First, the group would like to reiterate it's thanks to Cllr Patch for cutting the grass. It enabled so much more other work to be done on the day by the group, including cutting back the roadside weeds to improve visibility and selective pruning. Sadly, one of the mature plum trees had, unexpectedly, fallen victim to disease and the weather. Cllr Orme had kindly used his chainsaw skills to enable us to clear it away. On a positive note, Ed Collacott had donated two cherry trees which were planted.

Looking to the future, the Orchard would benefit from linking to the ongoing community use of the cricket field. This could best be achieved by laying the boundary hedge to open up visibility. Access could then be achieved by a simple timber bridge across the stream. If funds could be found to do this we think it would encourage more community participation in the maintenance of the Orchard. After discussion, it was agreed that the Clerk was to add hedge laying to the draft budget for next year.

INVITATION TO TENDER FOR PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY MAINTENANCE CONTRACT

Tenders are invited for a contract with the Parish Council for maintenance work on the public rights of

way in the parish and, on a case by case basis, other parcels of land

Scope of Project:

Trimming and clearance of vegetation to allow unimpeded year-round access and full use of the stiles/kissing gates for walkers on footpaths, bridleways and byways within the parish of Dunkerton and Tunley including sufficient access for horse riders on bridleways and vehicles on byways.

Additionally, from time to time there may be a requirement for maintenance of the Swan Bus Shelter Land, the copse at the East end of the church yard, the grass bank below the railings at the top of The Hollow and Dunkerton Green and Triangle and other work that may arise during the contract period. Any additional work will attract an additional separate payment to be agreed per job.

Date of commencement: April 2018

Notes:

A formal contract will be signed between the parties involved. This will be a three-year contract, subject to conditions. The successful bidder will take direction from the Parish Councillor with Lead responsibilities for Public Rights of Way.


