

Report on the Dunkerton & Tunley Parish Council Meeting 25 October 2018

Wheelwrights Footpath

This will not be financed by the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) money received by BANES as they are following national government guidance in using it for major infrastructure projects. Therefore the parish council will have to try to get this onto the BANES Highways capital budget programme.

Tunley Clean Up

There are 3 areas that need addressing – around the mine tub, the Stoneage Lane junction and the Palmers Lane junction.

Review of the B3115 Speed Limit

Concerns have been expressed by parishioners about the speed of traffic along the B3115 both in Tunley village and outside of Tunley. Based on the current low level of accidents on the B3115 involving personal injury, and recognizing current BANES budget constraints, it is highly unlikely that that the Parish Council could persuade BANES to undertake any new or additional measures to respond to these concerns.

Rural Transport

Cllr Rosemary Naish of Clutton Parish Council presented the idea of a community bus from Clutton through Farmborough, Timsbury, Meadgate and Tunley to Odd Down Park and Ride. This is in response to the reduction of the 179 service which is guaranteed only to next July/August. The initial proposal is that a steering group comprised of representatives from Clutton,

Farmborough, Timsbury, Camerton and Dunkerton and Tunley Parish Councils, put together a detailed proposal to set up a community bus. The funding available is only for running the bus so each parish would need to make a grant of c£200 this year to pay for the set up work. It would be intended to get the bus up and running by next July. Keynsham Dial A Ride has agreed to let such a scheme use one of their buses and would apply for a licence. The community bus would follow a set route and a set timetable that anyone can use rather The Parish Council than a dial a ride model. happy to support this initiative so long as it would not confuse or delay the current rural transport initiative which the Parish Council is supporting (launched by BANES and the local parishes at a meeting at Timsbury in April). Cllr Robinson then reported how the reduced 179 timetable bus times and the current 768 buses run at similar times. The Clerk would write to BANES expressing their thanks that the service has been saved but point out the clashing timetables.

Finance.

The balance of funds as at 25 October is £16,681.85 and without the Community Infrastructure Levey (CIL) reserves £12,995.01.

The new Local Plan Options Consultation will run until 21 December.

Highways and Public Rights of Way

The bridleway at the bottom of Blind Lane is being blocked by parked cars. It was agreed to position 2 posts to ensure vehicles cannot block the bridleway but horses can still get through. Cllr Gardiner kindly agreed to donate 2 posts for the purpose. Cllr Patch volunteered to organize and carry out this work. Cllrs Orme and Robinson offered to assist with installation of the posts.

Parish Council Flood Representative Report.

Cllr Orme reported on his participation in a visit for Local Flood Reps organized by the West of England Rural Network to Fairford in the Cotswold Water Park to see the preventative work on flooding being undertaken there. Basically the lesson taken away was to get all stakeholders involved and sell of the benefits of watercourse management rather than focusing just on the costs and work involved in flood prevention.
