#### New Year Breakfast: Sunday 6th January





#### Report of the Dunkerton & Tunley Parish Council Meetings 29 November 2018 and 10 January 2019

# Rural Transport, the Recent Bus Cuts and the Tunley Public Meeting on 10 January

Following concerns raised by parishioners about the recently reduced 179 service, the parish council held a public meeting about the recent bus cuts to let parishioners know what the current situation is and what the parish council has been doing about it over recent months. This meeting was well attended, with 84 people present. The chairman of the council Cllr Orme summarised the events of the last year including the decision by First Bus to withdraw the commercial 179 service. He noted that B&NES Council had rescued some level of service by moving the Sunday service subsidy to the Monday to Friday service. Cllr Orme then reported that at present there is much uncertainty about the future of the bus service through Tunley, particularly beyond August 2019 when the BANES subsidy is due to cease. Also, no-one knows what users actually want in the way of bus services or community transport. There is much work yet to be done to find all this out.

Following brief presentations from the 3 senior B&NES Council representatives attending, the meeting was opened up to questions from the floor. Parishioners raised concerns about the criteria used to determine levels of bus subsidy, how the value of bus services is measured, the reduction in the 179 service over the last year, the current ticketing regime and how it discourages use, the effect on local house prices, and

the high cost of taxis as an alternative form of transport. It was agreed that a new Rural Transport Partnership group, led by Cllr Paul Myers (BANES Cabinet member for Economic and Community Regeneration,) would look at what the needs of users are and possible solutions - including the idea of a new community bus service through Tunley. Dunkerton & Tunley parish council will be involved in this new group and related work on the community bus initiative led by Cllr Rosemary Naish, Chairman of Clutton Parish Council. The parish council will keep local residents regularly informed of progress on all aspects of the bus services issue via the Batch, Parish Website & the parish council Facebook page.

#### Proposed Extension of the Wheelwrights Footpath.

As it was reported that the majority of the land over which the proposed extension of the footpath would have to go is no longer available, this project is now a non-starter. Cllr Robinson would thank those who have assisted with this project and the action will be closed.

#### Tunley Clean-Up.

The suggestion to have a weekend's effort to clean up some parts of the village will be looked at again in the spring. The Stoneage Lane junction is one of the areas in need of attention. It was reported that one of the TRC voluntary grounds maintenance team was willing to keep this grass cut regularly. Post meeting note: - Cllrs Gardiner and Patch have cut the hedge and grass.

#### Finance.

#### Parish Council Funds.

The balance of funds as at 10 January is £13,487.61 and without its community infrastructure levy reserves £10,442.77.

#### **Budget and Precept Setting**

In light of supportive comments from parishioners at the preceding public meeting about rural bus services and their willingness to fund the work by the parish council on possible solutions, a budget based on a 5% increase in the precept was unanimously approved.

#### **New Local Plan Options Consultation.**

The parish council has responded by stating that of the 3 options presented in the Consultation (details on BANES website) it would prefer the option based on less focused development outside the Green Belt The parish council agreed with both the new definition of infilling and the removal of Housing Development Boundaries from villages within the Green Belt. Removal of the Housing Development Boundary would help local decision-making on housing development.

#### **New Planning Applications**

Planning Application REF 18/05260/FUL Lakmuthu Cottage Fosseway Dunkerton Erection of first floor extension with front and rear dormers. The parish council unanimously supported this application.

Planning Application REF 19/00025/FUL Old Hayhurst House Stoneage Lane Tunley Erection of bespoke timber and double glazed garden room following demolition of existing. The parish council unanimously supported this application.

We do sincerely appreciate all those years of going out collecting door to door for two weeks on cold and wet November evenings. Enjoy your retirement.
