Report of Dunkerton & Tunley Parish Council Meeting 21 February

Community Facilities

Following requests from local residents in Tunley to increase the space for the village library it was agreed that the community library would be retained in the bus shelter and additional space for this popular library created by reinstalling book shelves in the phone box, with a new "Community Library" sign.

Rural Transport

A new Rural Transport Partnership Group is to be established by B&NES with the intention of solving the medium to long term problem of the lack of the rural transport, and to bring together all the current activities going on to seek shorter term action. At the same time, efforts will continue to save the 179 service and to explore the setting up of a new community bus service from Clutton to Bath.

(Post meeting note: at a subsequent meeting of campaigners and Parish Council representatives on 26th Feb, it was reported that good progress had been made to ensure that the 179 would be maintained beyond August 2019, when the current B&NES subsidy (that keeps the service in place) runs out.

Keep Britain Tidy's Great British Spring Clean/Tunley Clean Up Day

Further to the suggestion of a Tunley Parishioner last year, it was agreed to hold a Tunley clean-up day as part of this recently announced national initiative. This would be publicised in the April Batch and support would be requested from B&NES Council.

(Post meeting note: it is planned to hold the clean-up day on Sunday 7th April. More detail to follow)

Finance

The balance of funds is £12,815.06 and without the Community Infrastructure Levy funds is £9,770.22.

Public Rights Of Way Repairs – Your Help Needed from Cllr Di Prescott

B&NES Council works with a volunteer group from the Bath Ramblers on improvements to public rights of way. We have been offered their services to work on the footpaths in the Parish for one day a week so the Parish Council needs your help to make best use of this volunteer resource. The Parish Council would like to ask any keen ramblers, dog walkers or other users of the footpaths to report any repairs and or improvements that will make the footpaths easier to use. The type of work undertaken by the Bath Ramblers volunteers includes Replacement of stiles with kissing gates (subject to the landowner's permission)

- Repair of bridges
- Installation of signage
- Clearance of overgrown vegetation
- Installation of steps
- Waymarking

Update on Rural Transport - from Martin Robinson.

David Orme reported in the March edition of The Batch that a new group was being formed under Cllr Paul Myers leadership (B&NES Council Cabinet Member for Economic & Community Regeneration) following the public meeting at the TRC on 10th January. The Rural Transport Partnership Group has been formed and was given the go ahead at Parishes' Liaison Meeting on the 6th March. At the Liaison meeting Cllr Myers confirmed that First Bus have given an undertaking that the 179 service will not be withdrawn in August, and that it will continue to operate as present. He also confirmed that First Bus are giving serious consideration to alternative proposals, put forward by a local group with whom your parish council is involved, to reroute both the 179 & 172 services to provide an increase in the number of local villages covered, improved frequency and, possibly Saturday services.

The question of the 768 and 179 services operating on almost the same timetable is still being followed up.

We will continue to keep you updated on developments.



Keep Britain Tidy Great British Spring Clean 2019

Keep Britain Tidy needs our help. This year, via their Great British Spring Clean, they are hoping to inspire around half a million people to join forces to collect and safely dispose of litter from our streets, parks and beaches, recycling as much as possible.

We want to stand together to declare that litter – that degrades the beauty of our rural environment and threatens to harm wildlife – is not acceptable in Dunkerton & Tunley Parish.

Last year, a concerned Parishioner in Tunley asked whether an effort might be made to tidy up the village. At the time it was agreed that something might be done early this year, and this call from Keep Britain Tidy is the ideal opportunity now to respond. So, Dunkerton & Tunley Parish Council proposes we take part in the Keep Britain Tidy Great British Spring Clean by holding a village

clean-up in Tunley on Sunday 7 April commencing 10.00 am. We look forward to welcoming as many volunteers as possible to this event - all you need to do is turn up on the day. The meeting place on the day is Tunley Recreation Centre at 10.00 am.

Some safety clothing, collection bags and other litter picking equipment will be available on the day. We are dealing with BANES to sort that out. It will help if volunteers could bring a fluorescent jacket if they have one, and any simple garden hand tools to help with the sweeping and weeding we have in mind. Whilst litter clearing is the National event we would like to tidy up the planted area at the junction with Stoneage Lane, the grass verge on the approach into the village from the Bath direction, where the Coal Tub is located, and generally tidy up through the village by weeding & sweeping gutters and cutting grass verges.

While we are happy for you just to turn up it would be useful if you could let the parish council know in advance that you are interested in taking part. Please let the Clerk know on clerk.dunkerton@googlemail.com.

We don't propose to hold an organised event in either Dunkerton or Withyditich on the 7 April, but we hope that all parish residents will agree that the Campaign is a worthy one and is well worth supporting.

notable birthday by holding a wonderful tea party to which we were all invited. It was held at a suitably decorated Camerton Village Hall with a large number of friends and relations, delicious food and music played by the talented string quartet, Petit Soleil Strings.

Frances was also thanked for organising a very successful outing to London for 16 of us who travelled in an Arleen Coaches minibus with a very accommodating driver. With a few hours to entertain ourselves we went our separate ways depending on our interests and regrouped to tour the Houses of Parliament led by a very informative guide.

In Judy's absence, a suggestion was made that we take it in turns to act as president at future meetings. This could be fun!

Our evening's speaker was Sally Helvey, a Bath private guide but also a member of the Cleveland Pools Trust. She spoke well of the history of the Pools and surrounding area and showed some interesting and amusing slides. The Cleveland Pools at Bathwick were opened in 1815, built in a crescent shape, echoing the Royal Crescent. It was adjacent to the River from where it obtained its water and consisted of separate changing rooms for men and women plus a room called the ladies perpetual shower bath complete with fireplace. There was also a children's pool.

For many years a somewhat eccentric Captain Evans was in charge and one of the aims was for all children to be taught to swim by the age of 8.

The Pools were closed in 1984 and became a trout farm which in turn closed in 2005, but now the Trust is aiming to reopen it for sporting activities in 2021.

Our next meeting is on 9th April when the talk is about chocolate making, entitled "From Bean to Bar".

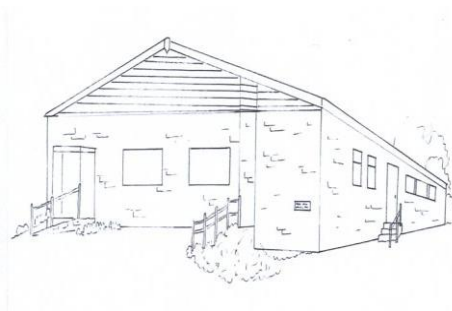

OBITUARY - - - HENRY JONES.

In memory of Henry Jones, who died recently. Henry lived all of his 92 years in the village of Tunley, and latterly at Meadow Dene which is the bungalow next to The Wheelwrights new housing estate, with his wife Thelma and daughter Jennifer, who must have been a great comfort and help to them in their later years.

Henry and his brother Bill, were adopted as young children by Ernie Holvey and his wife. Ernie was one of three blacksmiths in Tunley. Henry and Bill as young men, could see that tractors were now doing farm work, replacing horses, and they quickly began to build farm trailers. When I started farming in 1959 I asked Henry to build me a four wheel trailer, which is still in use to this day. Bill sadly died at quite an early age, and Ernie died in about 1963.

Henry carried on the business on his own, and Mr Gardiner of the John Bull (no relation!) who specialised in repairing large Barrel Organs, had the idea of purchasing large van lorries and Henry would put new floors in the lorry bed, and cut out the sides of the vehicle, which he then put hinges on, which opened up to reveal the organ. Henry converted dozens of these for Mr Gardiner, who then sold them all over Britain. Mr Box of Priston had one of these conversions and he regularly played it at Dunkerton or Tunley fetes. Henry continued to work until his retirement and then sold the business which then became a garage. And now, of course it is the aptly named Wheelwrights estate. This is in memory of an old and valued member of our community.
