You may have heard of Lee Abbey Christian Community in Devon; some of you may have stayed there. Jill and I are planning to take a group there from the four parishes in our Benefice from Friday, May 8th to Sunday, May 10th next year.

Lee Abbey has been in existence as an ecumenical Christian community since the end of World War 2, and is made up of young people from over twenty nations. Ordained members of the Church of England, and a team of helpers lead the community.

It's situated on the spectacular North Devon coast between Lynton and Woody Bay. The views are stunning and there will be plenty of opportunity to enjoy the coastline and countryside around the Abbey.

We'll be sharing with two other parish groups in a weekend of worship, teaching and leisure

activities. The standard of accommodation is excellent, and the atmosphere in the communal dining area and lounges is friendly and welcoming. Mealtimes are shared with members of the community, and the parishes are encouraged to mix and share a weekend of fellowship and fun! Age is no barrier: our last parish group comprised ages 6-96, and one of our group, aged 92, had a go on the zip wire!

Lee Abbey's wonderful for families with children, as there's a team dedicated to running a children's programme during the weekend, and the youngsters always have a great time.

We need to move swiftly to confirm our booking, so please let us know, as soon as possible, if you're interested in coming. We don't know the exact cost of the weekend yet, but it will be around £150pp. We'll be collecting deposits fairly soon in order to secure our booking. Please sign up on the forms available in church and from the Rectory. We'll also organise a coach or minibus, though some people might prefer to travel independently.

Report of the Annual Parish Council Meeting 23 May 2019

At the first meeting of the new Parish Council David Orme was appointed Chairman and Nick Patch was appointed Vice Chairman. In light of Robert Gardiner's decision not to stand again Cllr Orme thanked him for all his service on the Parish Council over the years and explained that there will be a presentation on 12 July at Dunkerton Parish Hall 7 pm followed by refreshments. The Parish Council also look forward to working with our two new ward councillors – Matt McCabe and Neil Butters

Update on Rural Transport Initiative and Community Bus Idea

The new Rural Transport Partnership Group is in the process of forming to look at solving the medium to long term problem of the lack of rural transport services, D&TPC will be represented on that group by Cllrs Orme & Robinson. In the shorter term, the Timsbury led group, which also includes Cllrs Orme & Robinson is working on keeping the 179 service as per the undertaking given by First Bus. It was understood that the Timsbury Group would be seeking a meeting with the new Lib Dem administration regarding the 179 service as soon as possible, as a tender for this service has been issued by BANES.

Cllr Orme also reported that BANES had confirmed that it would not be seeking to alter the timetable of the 768 service to avoid clashes with the 179 service. This was due to

the adverse knock on effect that would be felt on the other villages served by the 768 service, Tunley and Timsbury being the only villages on that route where the timings of both routes are almost identical.

The balance of funds as at 23 May is £15,870.30 and without earmarked Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) reserves £12,825.46. Total Actual Expenditure and Income Against Budget 2018 2019 (excluding CIL income and

expenditure). Total receipts for the year end were £102 up against budget and total expenditure for the year was £1054 down against budget resulting in a surplus of £177.45. The budget forecast a £978.31 deficit.

Planning Application REF 19/00383/FUL 2 Longhouse The Hollow Dunkerton Erection of a detached double garage alongside the house. PENDING DECISION.

Report of Parish Council's Response to Planning Applications

Planning Applications REF 19/01907/FUL and 19/01908/LBA Erection of a single-storey extension to the north of Church House, partial demolition of existing outbuilding at the north boundary of the site, and extending of the existing lean-to single-storey extension on the south side of Church House. The parish council unanimously voted to object to these applications primarily because of the adverse effect the large extension would have on the façade of the host listed building – it was thought that the existing façade was central to the aspect and character of the listed building.

Unfortunately, Robert was ill on the day and unable to be here - we wish him a very speedy recovery. At very short notice, the Reverend Tony Roake stepped in and opened the 2019 Dunkerton Fair..

All stalls appeared to be doing brisk business throughout the afternoon, while the teas and cake stall was especially busy.
