

Fiver a Foot of Floor

The TRC hall has encountered a significant damp problem under the wooden flooring in the hall and we have no choice but to replace the floor. We believe that the current floor is the original for the building, so dates back to the 60's!

We will be using safety vinyl as a replacement similar to that on the floor in the two side wings of the hall, but this time in a contrasting lighter colour.

We've calculated the size and obtained quotes and the cost to replace the floor equates to £5 per square foot and we think that 'Fiver a Foot' has a nice ring to it! Donations will be most welcome.

Everyone that donates, regardless of amount will get their name listed in a 'Role of honour', which we will get produced and hung in the hall. Some of you may have seen something similar that was previously done for the 'Raise the Roof' appeal.

Report from Dunkerton & Tunley Parish Council

Parish Council Meetings

In line with government regulation in response to COVID 19 the parish council did not hold its usual Annual Parish Meeting and Annual Parish Council Meeting. However, virtual Parish Council Meetings were held in April, June and July 2020. It is planned to return to physical meetings as soon as we are allowed to. While we continue to hold remote meetings via Zoom parishioners are very welcome to "attend" by dialling in. For any help with this please contact the clerk or the chairman.

Rural Transport News

The West of England Combined Authority's (WECA) Bus Strategy has now been adopted and published. It is available via the Travelwest website. The parish council contributed to the consultation on this. It is a regional document, so we await further news as to how local rural bus services through the parish will be planned and funded once the Government's advice to avoid the use of public transport is withdrawn post COVID. This will not happen anytime soon. In the meantime, the contract for the 179 bus service has been extended from August 2020 to February 2021.

Finance

The balance of funds as at 30 July is £12,531.75 and without CIL reserves £11,531.75.

PLANNING

Planning Application Decisions by BANES Council

Planning Application 19/04865/FUL Lower Tunley Farm Stoneage Lane Tunley: Erection of new farm building APPROVED.

Planning Application 20/00331/FUL Highacres Bath Road Tunley: Erection of single storey rear extension, first floor extension to existing single storey annexe following demolition of existing conservatory and bootroom. General alterations to existing building (Resubmission) PERMITTED.

Planning Application 20/00468/VAR Swans Way Fosseway Dunkerton: Variation of condition 2 (plans list) of application 19/03937/FUL (Erection of first floor extension and reinstatement of front bay window stone mullions and hipped slate roof.) PERMITTED.

Planning Application 19/05564/FUL Retention of Existing Stables, Tunley Colliery, Blind Lane, Tunley. APPROVED. This now means that any proposed change of use on this site will require planning permission.

Planning Application 20/01160/FUL Tyning Cottage Tunley Road Tunley: Erection of a single storey dining room and porch extension and upgrading outbuilding for utility. APPROVED.

Meadow Dene Bath Road Tunley: Provision of loft conversion with rear dormer and replacement of existing conservatory. The parish council supported this application as it complies with BANES planning policies GB3, GB2, CP8 and ST7 if the parking is increased. APPROVED.

The Old Swan Fosseway Dunkerton: Erection of orangery following demolition of existing conservatory. APPROVED.

Parish Council Responses to Planning Applications

Parcel 4823, Old Dunkerton Hill, Dunkerton Repairs, reinstatement, alteration and extension of two livestock barns to convert into an agricultural storage area. The parish council unanimously opposed this application as there is not enough detail in the application on the possible use combined with concerns about vehicle access and the effect on the adjacent listed building. PENDING CONSIDERATION

Westbury Farm Tunley Road Tunley: Change of use from light industrial use class B1(c) to dwelling houses C3. Encompassing part demolition of existing buildings and conversion of retained elements to form 4 No. detached dwellings plus related external works. The parish council voted unanimously to support this application as it conforms to BANES planning policies. PENDING CONSIDERATION.

20/02659/FUL 7 Fairfield, Tunley: Proposed formation of driveway in section of front garden to create two off-street parking spaces. The parish council supported this application.

BANES Local Plan Partial Update

A response to the local plan partial update consultation had been submitted. Two sites for limited residential infilling had been offered to BANES for consideration under their call for possible sites for housing. The parish council believe that this sort of very limited development could help local young families stay in the parish if the housing is affordable and with appropriate development conditions attached. The parish council awaits any response from BANES.

National Planning Policy Reform

The parish council is considering its response to the consultation on the government's proposed planning reforms recently reported in the national press and on TV.

A367 Safety

Concern was expressed by a number of residents on the Dunkerton Coronavirus WhatsApp Group about the safety of the A367 at Dunkerton following another accident.

There have been a couple of accidents recently. However based on the traffic accident statistics received from the police In July nothing has materially changed since BANES' formal 2018 safety review of this road. The most recent accident happened just after the degradation in the effectiveness of BANES preventative measures taken on the northbound carriageway after the A367 Safety Review. This had already been reported to BANES via Fix My Street and has been scheduled for cutting.

Concern was also expressed about safety on the southbound carriageway approaching and opposite the canal layby. Unfortunately, maintenance of a lot of the vegetation there is the responsibility of private landowners or is associated with the unadopted road – these are not the responsibility of BANES to cut. However BANES has action in hand to get the 40mph speed limit "countdown" warning signs cleared of vegetation.

A parishioner recently submitted one of the Police's new online speeding complaint forms about speeds on Dunkerton Hill and the increased risk of accidents. In response to this the police are to deploy data capture boxes. These are small black boxes that capture all speeds 24/7 and will therefore give the police an updated, clear and scientific analysis of whether there is a speeding issue or not at this location. We await the results of this analysis with interest.

The Council is pleased to see that a local resident is testing the water to see whether, in view of the concerns expressed, there is enough local interest to set up a Community Speedwatch Group. The Parish Council will give this its full support if a decision is taken by residents to go ahead with it. More information on this is available via

Pick-your-own fun for all the family at Pumpkin Picking Patches

EVERY MEMBER of the family can have plenty of fun in the great outdoors at Pumpkin Picking Patches this October — and there will be lots of the Halloween favourites to go around, with in excess of 200,000 pumpkins planted, incorporating 32 varieties, including Crown Prince, Cinderella Pumpkin, Casparitas, the small Munchkins, the warty Knucklehead and the big white Polar Bear.

This year there are FOUR pumpkin-filled sites, each one offering pick-your-own pumpkins, as well as Halloween crafts — perfect for little people who love to make things, as well as bigger people who enjoy carving pumpkins for the big day itself and who enjoy cooking with these versatile fruits.

The four sites are in Bath (Somerset), Cardiff (South Wales), Fordingbridge (Hampshire) and Sompting (West Sussex). Bath, Cardiff and Fordingbridge will open on 10-11, 17-18 and 24-31 October, from 9.30am until 4pm, while Sompting will open on 17-18 and 24-31 October during the same hours. Every site has its own large car park and parking and entry is free — yes totally FREE!

Niall Smith, the 'pumpkinologist' who, along with his Dutch partner Suzanne Hennekens, is the driving force behind Pumpkin Picking Patches, comments: "Everyone who comes to our Pumpkin Picking Patches is guaranteed a great time. There are literally thousands of pumpkins at every site. People collect a wheelbarrow in which they can 'round up' their perfect pumpkins — all for an incredibly reasonable price. Our pumpkins, which come in a huge array of sizes, start at just £1. Our Pumpkin Picking Patches are the perfect places to get children away from their gadgets and let them run around in the fresh air. There aren't many attractions these days that are free to enter, and after some cost-effective pumpkin picking fun, you drive home with your car boot full of these glorious fruits to craft and cook at home!"

At the **Bath Pumpkin Picking Patch**, located at the Globe Roundabout on the A4 near the village of Newton St Loe (postcode: BA2 9BB), visitors will find in excess of 70,000 awesome pumpkins ripe for the picking on a 15-acre site. Additionally, children (and adults, of course) can hunt for Toad, check out the amazing new photo opportunities and the famous pumpkin house. Also why not try making your own witch's broom — for flying as opposed to brushing! — or craft your own magic wand, or tin can bat. Hot and cold snacks will be on sale.

Everything that Niall and Suzanne do is undertaken with 'green' credentials in mind, meaning that wood has been sourced and coppiced locally for the creative art of making magic wands and brooms, they have adopted a no-plastic policy, and they have also cut the energy needed to print their billboards and signs by 40% using UV printing techniques.

The couple came up with the idea of their Pumpkin Picking Patches two years ago. "We have worked in events and catering for over 20 years and before that we did new business developments for companies in the UK and abroad," explains Niall. "We were invited to a Pumpkin Patch to do coffee and food and we realised what an amazing business venture pumpkins would be. We really saw the potential and dipped our toes in in 2018, but are now fully committed to Pumpkin Picking Patches."

This year Pumpkin Picking Patch has employed 40 staff to help run its four sites — the most it has ever had, and which it runs alongside its two mazes (www.pickingpatch.com). The sowing of 210,000 pumpkins over 35 acres has been done by the farming owners of the fields with a machine called a drill.
